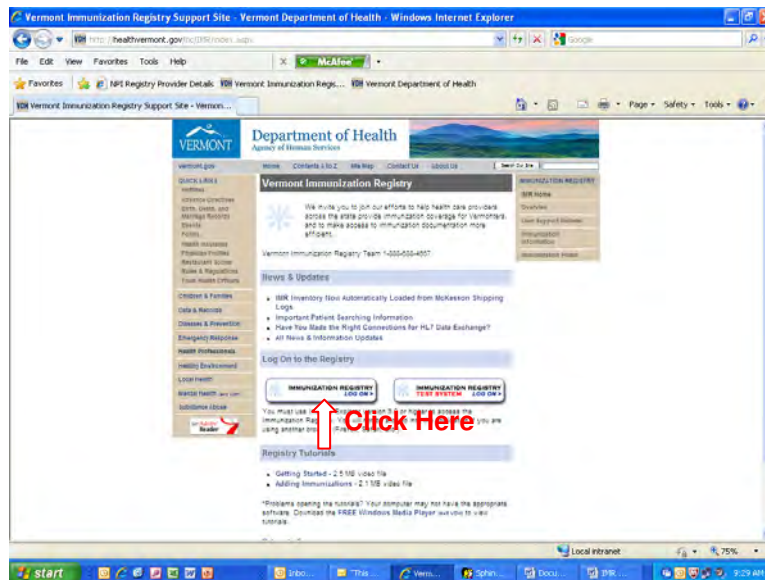
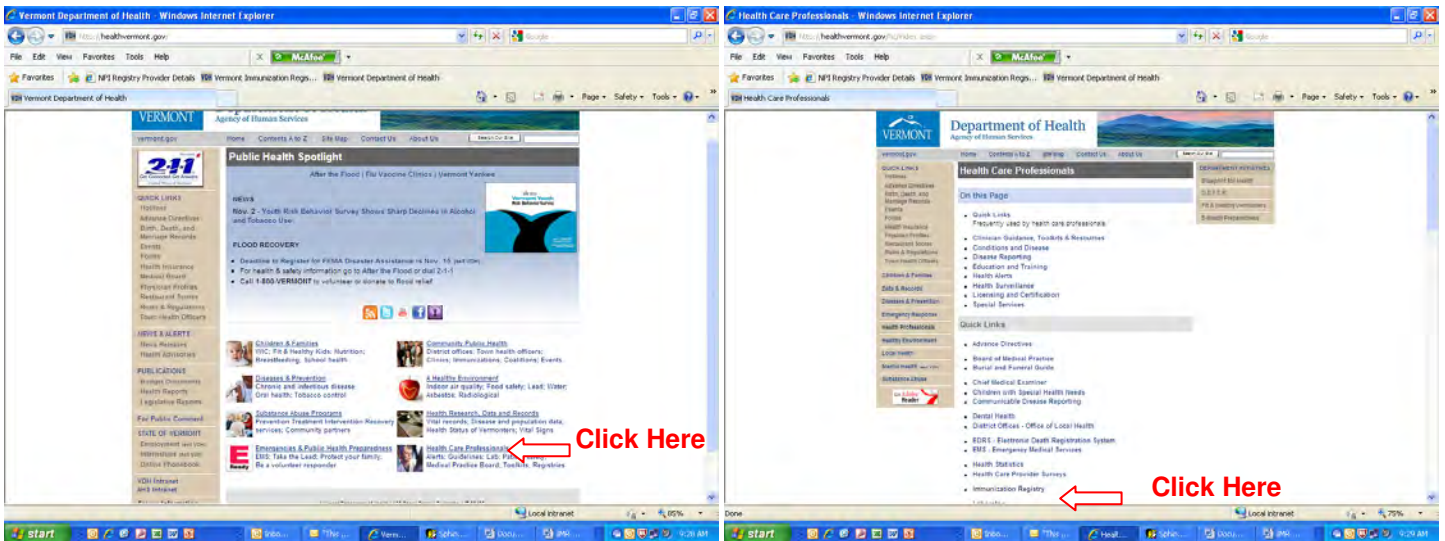

VERMONT IMMUNIZATION REGISTRY (IMR)

HOW DO I LOG INTO THE VERMONT IMMUNIZATION REGISTRY?

- Open Microsoft Internet Explorer. You must use Internet Explorer – other browsers (like Safari, Firefox, etc. will not work).
- Type <http://healthvermont.gov> in the address bar.
- Click [Health Care Professionals](#) on the bottom right side of the screen.
- Click [Immunization Registry Program](#) in the middle of the screen under [Quick Links](#).



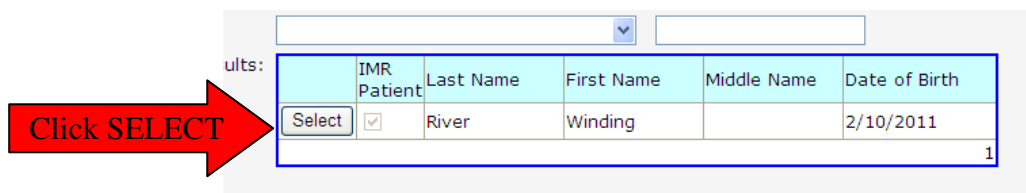
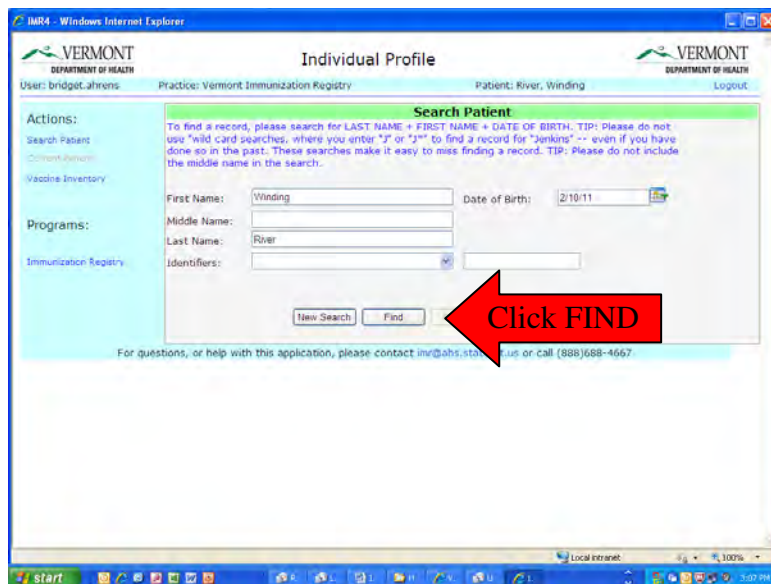
- Click [Immunization Registry](#) button to log into the registry.
- Enter your user name, password, and click [OK](#).



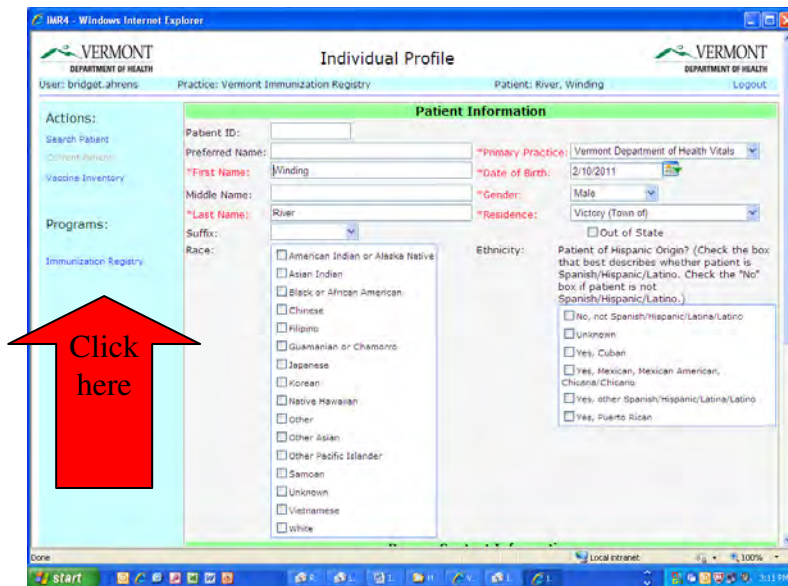
HOW DO I SEARCH FOR A PATIENT?

Note: Because LCC Providers are required to report on children in their care under age 6, they will only be able to view records for children under age 6.

- Enter the patient's last name AND first name AND date of birth. (Use the Tab key or mouse)
- Click [Find](#). A list of possible matches will be displayed.
- Click [Select](#) next to the correct patient name.

LICENSED CHILD CARE REPORT
