Note

4. A Chronic/Resolved case, as defined by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, is laboratory-confirmed with no acute signs and symptoms of viral hepatitis.
5. An Acute case is confirmed with a positive HCV test with discrete onset of symptoms consistent with acute viral hepatitis, and jaundice or elevated serum aminotransferase levels > 400 IU/L.
